




April 17, 2021

Bill Neale, MMR will be our Presenter on April 17, 2021. Bill is a member of the NCR, Division 6, where he served on the North Central Region Board of Directors in several roles. Bill currently serves the NMRA in the Central Director position.

Bill will be leading us on a tour of his model railroad. The Pennsylvania Railroad built northwest and due west in the 1860's, both lines had a distinctly different flavor. The line northwest went across the Ohio and Indiana flat lands, and was the **Pittsburgh**. Fort Wavne and Chicago. The line built due west across the more rugged southern Ohio highlands was the Pittsburgh, Cincinnati, Chicago and St. Louis Railroad. Since the PCC&St.L went across the West Virginia Panhandle, it acquired the nickname "the Panhandle Division". I model from Mile Post 25 to Mile Post 50 west of Pittsburgh on the Panhandle, as it might have looked in September of 1939. This means having a substantial steam engine roster, and lots of 40' and 36' cars.

The railroad uses DCC sound equipped engines and includes a 2-mile helper district. The major yard is at Weirton where several lines branch off and a major steel mill was located. Tower operators, using a full signal system, control the trains. Trains are operated on a sequence with 4-5 trains on the mainline on average, keeping the railroad pretty busy. Cars are routed using waybills. Usually 10-11 people are required to operate the railroad. The PCC&St.L was featured in Great Model Railroads 2010.







March 5, 2021 Train Watching / Chuck Hart

Friday, 5 March turned out to be pretty nice day, weather wise, so Ron Christensen, MMR and Willy Worick and I decided to get out for some fresh air. We met about 9:30am in Galien, MI and Ron drove us down to the New Carlisle area for some train watching. We no sooner pulled into a favorite spot and along came a hot NS heading west. The day looked promising! And then! There were no trains for a long time. Anyway, we wondered around for a while and ended up sitting on Walnut Road near the Gavilon Grain complex. Gavilon Grain is a big operation with headquarters in Omaha, NB. The company currently has 92 locations in the Midwest as far south as Texas and out west to Idaho.

The New Carlisle location has it own locomotive on site. It's an ex Army GE 65 Tonner. As luck would have it the facility was hard at work. A long string of covered hoppers were being loaded so we watched for a while. The loco crew picked up five empties at a time and brought them over to the elevator. A worker on an elevated platform connected his harness to the OSHA Railcar Fall Protection System (yellow structure above the railcars). This structure allows the worker to freely walk from one end of the cars to the other and be protected from falling to the ground. He stepped off the platform onto the hoppers and opened the hatch covers on the cars. As the string of cars moved under the discharge shoot filling the hoppers the worker closed and sealed the hatches. The process of filling five cars was time by Willy and was averaged at just over 5 minutes per load! The worker went back to the platform while the loco crew moved the cars to an adjacent siding and picked up 5 more empties for loading. It was great to see an industry in action. We did see a South Shore train and a CP Autorack train while we were out but by then we declared it was time for lunch and we headed over to Bob's 19th hole on US 20 for a sandwich and their good Trice Baked Potato. All in all it was a very good day.

June 19, 2021

Rich Mahaney will be our Presenter on June 19, 2021. Rich is a member of the NCR, Division 9 and serves as a NCR Director at Large. In June's presentation Rich will tell us about "Storage Containers For Solids, Liquids and Gases For Model Railroaders".

Rich Mahaney has been involved with model railroads and trains since he was about 5 years old when that first "Christmas train set" arrived. The railroad and trains interest was further instilled and reinforced in Rich by his grandfather that would take Rich down to the train tracks in the Grand Rapids, MI area to watch trains with him, and the interest has never left. Rich has been interested in modeling the Great Northern Railway (GN) in an HO layout and the railroads that it interchanged with, between the state of Washington and the Midwest, as well as the movement of perishables in the late 1950's.

Rich is probably most known for his model railroad and railroad related clinics and photography that he has presented in many states and Canada. As an instructor/presenter, Rich has taught in 32 states and 4 countries.

Rich works in the fields of corporate industry and plant level loss control, emergency response, hazardous materials, emergency management, training programs development and delivery since 1972. 29 years of fire service emergency response experience and provides clinics related on loss control, emergency response, hazardous materials, and emergency management, training programs development and delivery and uses his knowledge to present clinics for the model railroad hobby.

CLAMPS (Part 2, By Chuck Hart)

We'll continue our discussion with some of the larger clamps that are useful during the building process of our layouts. This is by no means an exhaustive list but covers a wide variety for you to consider. In Part 3 we'll look at some of the items we use for our 'holding from flopping' on our workbench. If you have special or favorite clamps not shown here let us know about them.





ABOVE: Probably the two most common clamps found on our workbench are the large spring style in the left photo and 'C' clamps in the right photo.





ABOVE: Next on the workbench we'll probably see some Bar Clamps in the left photo. The bar clamps shown range in length from an 18 inch opening to over a 6-foot capability. Bar clamps can come in handy when building module framework. Next in the right photo an assortment of Trigger or Quick Grip Clamps and are handy because using one hand can usually tighten them against your work piece.

ABOVE: Commonly called Wood Screw Clamps are shown in the photo at left. The center photo shows a use for this type of clamp when a vice is not available. Their large jaws provide a very stable surface for their ability to hold parts from vibrating when used with power tools. We looked at small Vice Grips in part 1 so now we'll we look at the more common size, which are in the 8-10 inch length. The tool in the top of the picture to the right has a wide flat jaw surface that is handy for bending metal.

Next time in Part 3 we'll conclude this discussion as we look at some of the devices that are usually mounted to the workbench.
